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Stepping onto the campus of Cal State Fullerton, one of the first things that goes through my mind is, "I feel like I'm in a movie right now." It's lunch hour on Thursday and a sea of students are hurriedly passing through on their way to class. Old classmates and friends are catching up with each other, while an audience across the courtyard listens to the punk rock band playing. Amidst all the bustle you will find students of various backgrounds and ethnicities: Hispanic and Asian, agnostic and Christian, timid freshmen and arrogant seniors.

Last week I spent four days in Southern California at a conference for all the new staff and interns in our region, where we learned how to better engage the culture on our many diverse campuses. We spent one afternoon on the campus of CSU Fullerton initiating spiritual conversations with specifically

Latino students. Our desire was to find out more information about the Hispanic population on campus, and how we might be able to serve that community for the sake of the gospel. I found myself in

one conversation with Alex, a Latino student getting his Civil Engineering degree. After learning about Alex's background growing up in a Catholic home, I asked him what his spiritual life was like currently. Alex responded by saying, "Well, I'm still open to religion but not sure if I want that anymore." The conversation progressed into an opportunity to share the gospel with Alex, but there were still many barriers in the way of Alex truly placing his

trust and faith in Christ alone. This is the reality for most Latino students today. They have been taught to believe in God, but the idea of knowing God personally is foreign to them. Would you pray with me that **God will teach us and others what it means to** *know him*, **not just** *know about him*? J.I. Packer, in his book *Knowing God*, puts it this way: "A little knowledge of God is worth more than a great deal of knowledge about Him."

Intentionality Matters

"Things in life that matter take intentionality." God has been at work in my own life teaching me that the relationships I have play a crucial role in allowing me to bond with God and others. They even impact the way I view and relate to God. One way this plays out is with the men that I disciple here at Cal Poly. When I am being led by the Holy Spirit and becoming more like

Jesus, these men are growing more rapidly. Just the opposite is true when I struggle to walk with Jesus well; these men suffer the affects. Pray that I count the **privilege and responsibility of ministry**, and that I would **daily walk in the power of the Holy Spirit** so the gospel may go forth.

The past few months have been filled with important lessons and big decisions such as **deciding to step down from leading the trip to East Asia this summer**. Through these hard decisions I'm watching God shape my character before my eyes and teach me how to walk humbly with Him. It's comforting to know that God is "a refuge in the day of my distress."
