We greatly appreciated Mike's desire to reorient the way we approach the topic; not from the assumption of "Thou shalt not," but grounded by the freedom of God's design for healthy sexuality.

The room was filled with a rich sense of holiness and worship as students turned away from isolation and into the power of Christ!
