Does God care about injustice?

"The greatest injustice is no justice."

Have you ever thought about why we care about justice? Where does that value come from? As Christians, should we seek justice for all?

These are questions we don't typically think about every day, but they deeply shape our functional worldview and life choices. Thankfully, we worship a God who not only cares greatly about justice, but is the very essence of it. Much of the Biblical narrative is rooted in God restoring order and wholeness to His creation. That is good news!

We hosted a guest speaker from Ravi Zacharias International Ministries (RZIM) who came to speak about the origins of justice. In short, she made the case for why our intrinsic value and sense of justice is given to us by God the Creator. Her speech culminated with the story of Jesus forgiving the adulterous woman in John 8 (picture).

Many of our students involved with Cru at IUPUI attended the event, and a few asked good questions during the Q&A time. We're encouraged to see students growing in critical thinking and seeking truth! We also hope and pray that non-believers who attended would wrestle with the truth claims presented. *Would you also pray that we know how to disciple students in worshiping God with their mind*?

Lastly, we encourage you to prayerfully consider how you can display the love of Christ through seeking justice for others.
