4. Do you come from any kind of spiritual background? Was this a positive, negative, or neutral experience?
5. What connection do you think spirituality has with everyday life?
6. Who do you think Jesus was?
7. On a scale from 1 to 10, if possible, rate your desire to know God personally. (1 is low/10 is high)

A common way to start a conversation is to use a questionnaire that asks about people's perspectives. If people express a lack of interest, we respectfully move on.

It's true that most people, even the experienced, are a bit nervous to enter into a spiritual conversation with a friend or stranger. Usually, those nerves subside once the conversation is rolling. It's exhilarating to see students repeatedly share their joys and thrills as they celebrate these meaningful discussions afterward.

The enthusiasm among this year's freshmen was particularly compelling. Some didn't wait for the official week to begin before going out.

An upperclassman Cru leader posted this message midway through the week:

"... tonight in the course of 30 minutes or so I was at u south, the sac, and mem u. At all 3 locations, EVERYWHERE I looked it felt like there were people there sharing the gospel, I can't express how encouraging it is to see the movement I'm in carrying out the great commission right before my eyes out of love and joy and with passion and conviction! I can't wait to share and hear testimonies at the feast on Friday, you guys are amazing, keep up the great work! Jesus is worth our labor!"

People from a wide range of religious backgrounds across campus had the opportunity to consider what makes Christ special. Lots expressed appreciation for the conversations; 6 prayed to receive Christ.
