His enthusiasm to help others experience the new faith he discovered has driven him and another student to launch a new Campus Crusade movement on our campus entitled "Valor" to reaches out to ROTC students. As an ROTC student himself, Tyler has been working hard to lay the ground work so that every cadet and midshipman at UW would also be able to respond to Jesus and grow in faith. Recently, a handful of other cadets have expressed interest in joining Tyler to grow and reach out together in this venue.

Ending the year with all these students in place, we are hoping for great growth this fall in this new field on campus.

Badgers Helping Haiti--Hygiene Kits

Many of our students responded by teaming up with Global Aid Network (GAiN), Campus Crusade's relief ministry, to assemble 600 needed hygiene kits. As people have been cast away from their homes, unable to live outside, unable to properly bathe. susceptible to numerous illnesses, these kits are designed to bring some relief to this dire situation. Members of our ministry pursued financial donations as well as items to fill these kits, like soap, feminine pads, wash cloths, and bandages.







1,000,000 Meals for Haiti

The 60-some UW-Madison and UW-Platteville students and staff who attended our annual mission trip to Florida joined other Campus Crusade students to assemble over one million meals for Haiti. This was in addition to the primary mission of talking to thousands of Spring Breakers on the beach about Jesus. And it still was this year, even though the bus broke down and Scott and 53 others were delayed 29 hours and ended up spending all but 2 hours of Easter on the road.
